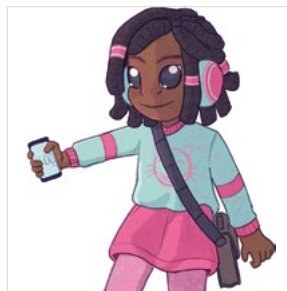
SUMMER READING CHALLENGE 2022: GADGETEERS

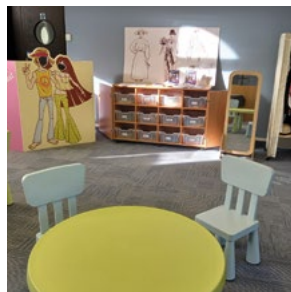

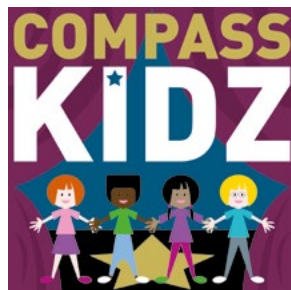

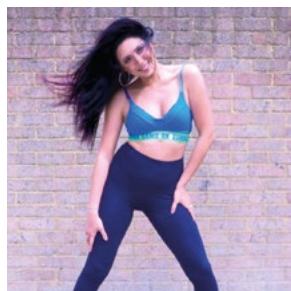
