We are close to the centre of Ickenham. Take the A40 and turn off onto the B466/A434.

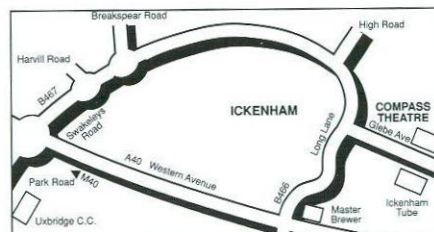
Turn towards Ruislip and Ickenham.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

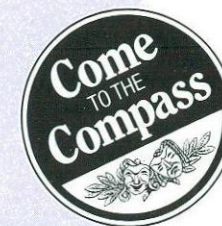
We are opposite the Ickenham Underground Station which is served by the Metropolitan and Piccadilly lines. The U1 bus runs from Uxbridge to Ickenham.

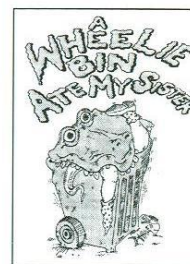

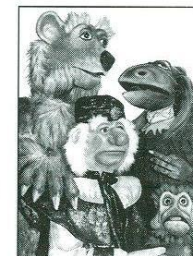
