Children are encouraged to join a band or orchestra when the necessary standard has been reached. The Junior Band and Junior String Orchestra are the first groups where children gain experience playing in an ensemble together with others of a similar standard. Children will normally have reached grade 1 standard to join these groups.

More than 20 other ensembles and choirs also operate, ranging in style from jazz to symphony orchestra, from junior groups to performance at an advanced level. Over 400 children and young people take part in these activities every week.
