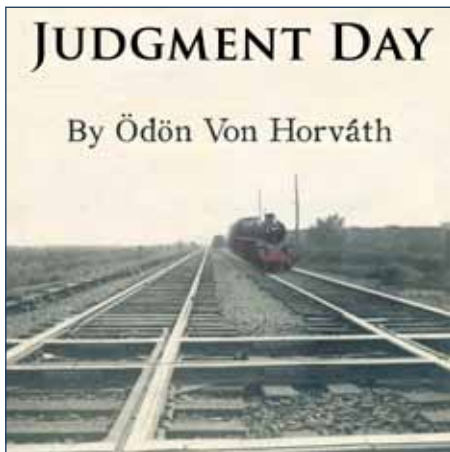

Set in a provincial backwater in Germany in 1937, Judgment Day highlights the issue of moral responsibility.

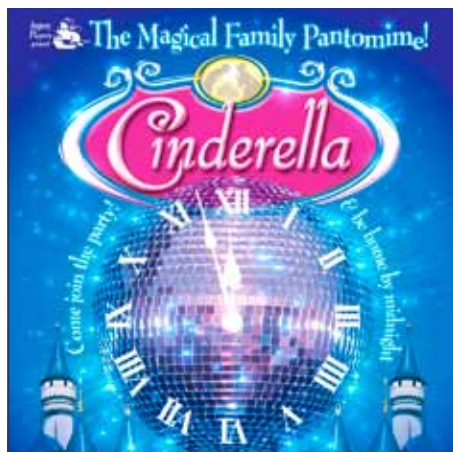

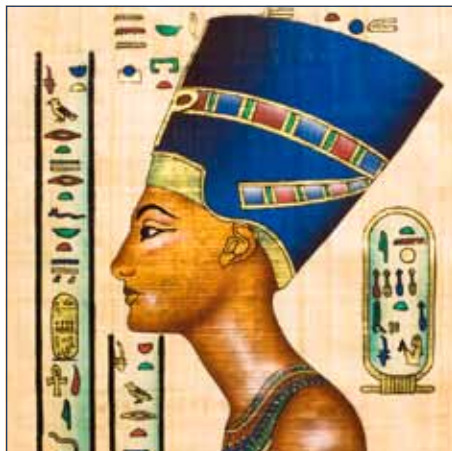
Falstaff

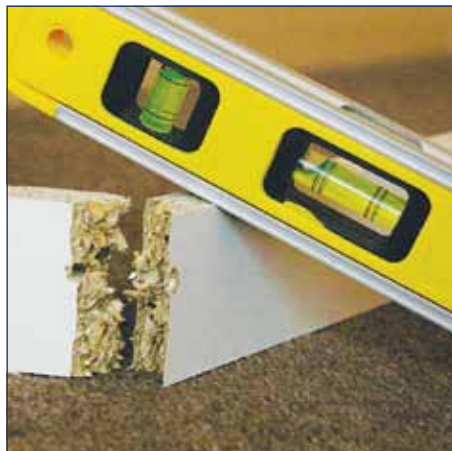

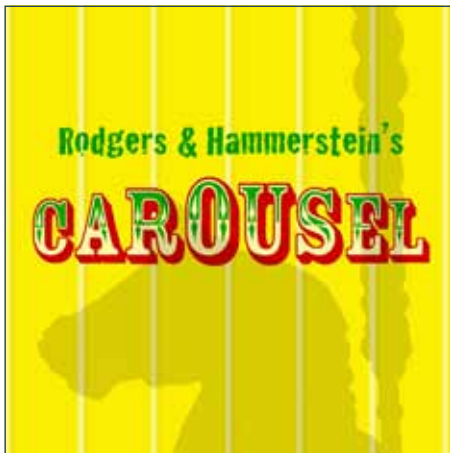

The Café and Wine bars are generally open 45 minutes before a show and during intervals and are staffed by volunteers.

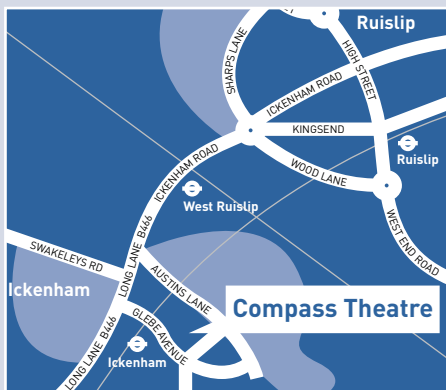
Getting Here

Duck Pond Markets

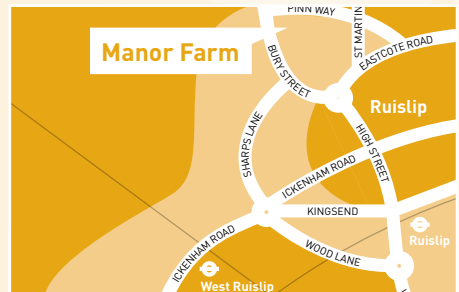
